

# WINDSCREEN BANNER INSTALLATION

Always consult your internal maintenance department to discuss the specifics of your project prior to starting installation.



1. Make sure the fence is in good condition and well anchored prior to installing windscreens.
2. Install with hem toward the fence. The smooth side should be facing the playing area or audience.
3. Starting at one end, lay out the full windscreen panel on the ground along the fence. Attach the top corner grommet to the fence with a bungee ball tie or zip tie fastener (see installation tips). Then, attach along the top, pulling the windscreen taught and attaching ties at the grommets.
4. Make sure every grommet is attached to the fence. This helps to evenly distribute the force of high wind loads and lessens the chance of individual ties or grommets breaking, causing damage to windscreen.
5. Ties should be attached to the fence in the same direction the panel is being pulled, rather than backward. As the fastener is tightened, it will pull the windscreen taught.
6. Work in approximately 10 feet sections. Once the first 10 feet or so of the top is attached, go back and secure the sides and bottom in the same way. Again, be sure to pull taut as each tie is secured.
7. If you are working with two or more people per panel, have one person work along the top and the second person follow along about 10 feet behind attaching the sides and bottom.
8. Repeat the same process for any additional panels.

## Installation Tips

1. We recommend using bungee ball ties rather than zip-tie fasteners. Because bungee ball ties offer some give, it will reduce the overall stress on your windscreen. Bungee ball ties are available through Team Fitz. Ask your sales rep for pricing.
2. Hang windscreens at least 6" off the ground, so you can easily access the grass next to the fence.
3. Fasten windscreen at all available grommets to evenly distribute the force of the wind.
4. Avoid hanging your windscreen on a windy day. It will slow down your progress and make it difficult to keep your windscreen tight as it is installed.
